Born in California, Patrick Long grew up on the Pacific Coast with a passion for waves. Surfing has remained one of his greatest hobbies. In his relaxed, self-assured manner, his off-the-cuff interviews are always a hit, and in front of TV cameras he is a true professional. With a career packed with wins and titles, Patrick Long always has a great story to share. In 2004, his first year as a Porsche works driver, he won his first 24 Hours of Le Mans. Again in 2007 he climbed to the top of the podium at the world's most famous endurance race. The American won the GT class of the American Le Mans Series three times, and repeated this feat at the Petit Le Mans. His list of successes also includes the 24 Hours of Daytona (2009) and the Sebring 12 hour race (2005, 2014), as well as victory at the Pirelli World Challenge in 2011.
