Patrick Pilet, Porsche driver of success with Porsche came in 2007 when he won the Carrera #92, at the Silverstone 6h, 10 Cup France, and the following year he received a contract as a Porsche factory pilot. In 2014, he won the WEC race in Shanghai and in 2015 he turned heads in the Tudor United Sports Car Championship. At the wheel of the 911 RSR, he not only celebrated Porsche's first overall victory at the Petit Le Mans classic on the storied Road Atlanta racetrack under very difficult conditions, but also secured the drivers' title in the GTLM class.

Patrick Pilet contests the IMSA Sports Car Championship with the Porsche 911 RSR run by the Porsche North America team as well as the 24 Hours of Le Mans for the Porsche Manthey team. At the Nürburgring 24-hour race he drives a Porsche 911 GT3 R.
